

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. *89,957* for *40* acres, issued in favor of *Magdalen Brent, widow of John Brent Private in Captain Cleveland's Company Mississippi Militia War of 1812*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *South East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Two in Township Three of Range one east in the District of lands subject to sale at Washington Mississippi, containing Forty acres and Seventy nine hundredths of an acre*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *which has been assigned to William Jacob Brent*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

William Jacob Brent

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said Tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said

William Jacob Brent, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
