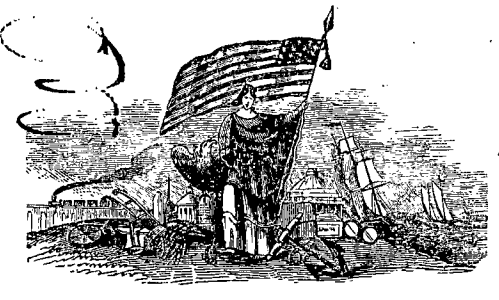

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved March 22d, 1852,

entitled "An Act to make Bounty Land Warrants assignable, and for other purposes," Warrant No. 711 for 160

acres, issued in favor of *Wilson Brown, private in Captain Scumblers' Company, Texas Volunteers, Two Services Indian War,*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the

*South West quarter of Section Thirty One, in Township Eight, of Range Eight East, in the district of lands subject to sale at Washington Mississippi. Containing One Hundred and Sixty Acres.*

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL: *Which has been assigned to Robert Montgomery &*

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

*Robert Montgomery, and to his heirs*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Robert Montgomery, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
