Butler, and to his heirs, the South East quarter of the South East quarter of Section Seven, the South West quarter of the South West quarter of Section Eight, the North West quarter of the North West quarter of Section Seventeen, and the North East quarter of the North East quarter of Section Eighteen, in Township Nine, of Range Five East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Jackson, Mississippi, containing One hundred and Sixty Acres, and Twenty three hundredths of an Acre

according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Land returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL, which said tracts have been located in satisfaction of the above mentioned Warrant, in pursuance of the Act of Congress above mentioned, approved February 11th, 1847. TO HAVE AND

TO HOLD the said parts of said section of land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said Nathan B. Whitehead, and to his

heirs and assigns forever.
