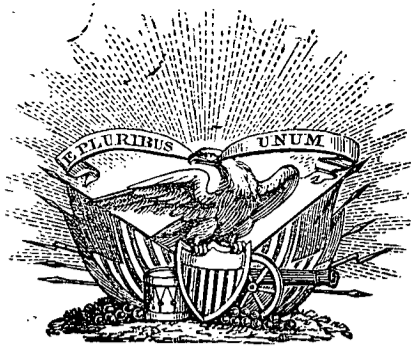

# The United States of America,

To all to whom these Presents shall come, Greeting:

Whereas, In pursuance of the Act of Congress, approved September 28th, 1850, entitled "An Act granting Bounty Land to certain Officers and Soldiers who have been engaged in the Military Service of the United States," Warrant No. 9,860, for 160 acres, issued in favor of *Thomas Lazarus, Corporal in Captain Engle's Company, Mississippi Volunteers,*

*Mar of 1812.*

has been returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE, with evidence that the same has been duly located upon the *North East quarter, of Section four, in Town-ship three, of Range seven East, in the District of Lands subject to sale at Washington, Miss-issippi, containing One hundred and sixty two acres, and eighty hundredths of an acre,* according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said Lands returned to the GENERAL LAND OFFICE by the SURVEYOR GENERAL:

Now Know Ye, That there is therefore granted by the UNITED STATES unto the said

*Thomas Lazarus,*

the tract of Land above described: TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said tract of Land, with the appurtenances thereof, unto the said *Thomas Lazarus, and to his*

heirs and assigns forever.
