Lois says she played basketball while in school at Morgantown. She is still a basketball fan. She belonged to the 4-H Club and was most interested in the sewing and canning projects.

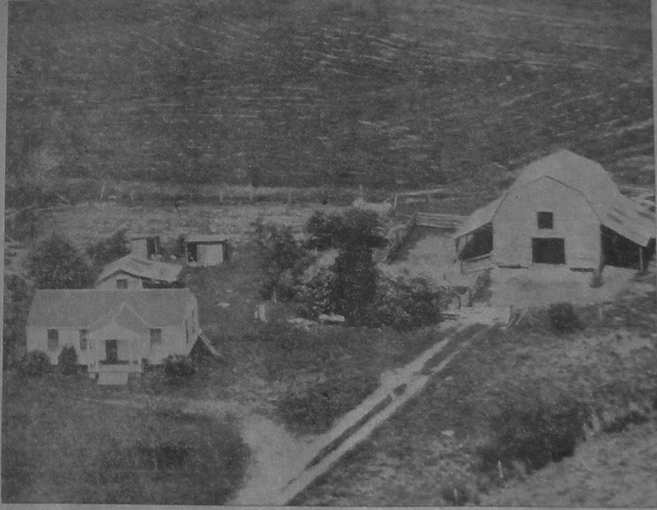
